Remembrance Day

To commemorate the <u>armistice agreement</u> that marked the end of the First World War, <u>Remembrance Day</u> was first observed in the <u>British Commonwealth</u> November 11, 1919. Several countries within the Commonwealth observe a moment of silence to remember the men and women who have served and continue to serve our country at the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. Although it is a federal statutory holiday, only three territories and six provinces in Canada acknowledge the day by closing businesses, schools, and banks (and Saskatchewan is one of those provinces).

Written by a Canadian physician, Dr. John McCrae, and first published in 1915, a famous World War I poem, "In Flanders Fields" references poppies as growing among the graves of the fallen in a region in Belgium. Starting in 1921, the poppy became a symbol of this day and money collected in the purchase of poppies supports programs and services for our veterans. You will notice many people wearing poppies. Poppies are meant to be worn on the left lapel of a coat or, as near to the heart as possible.

On this Remembrance Day, we encourage everyone to participate in a ceremony either virtually or, in-person. Information about ceremonies can be found <u>here</u>.
