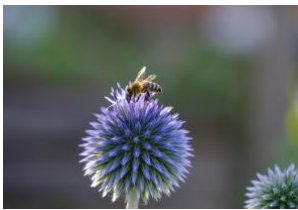

Marking the first day of summer in the Northern Hemisphere – June 20th is the longest day (and the shortest night) of the year! Saskatoon is located in the Northern Hemisphere. The summer solstice does not always happen on June 20th because it is determined by the sun's position.

Interesting facts about Summer Solstice include that unlike the Northern Hemisphere, in the Southern Hemisphere, the sun is at the lowest point and marks the start of winter. And in the Northern Hemisphere, your shadow is the shortest that it will be all year!
